

Danish Network for Women in Physics honorary award - The KIF Prize 2015

Purpose

The KIF Prize is awarded annually to raise awareness about the importance of women in physics. The prize should help identify female physicists as role models at universities as well as at high schools and in society and business.

Who can be nominated?

Candidates in physics-related subjects with a good record in one of the following fields:

- A young woman (pre associate professor level) who shows a potential or has made remarkable contributions within physics research
- A woman who shows extraordinary dedication within physics teaching
- A woman or a man who has done something special to make women in physics more visible, or to promote women in physics for instance by mentorship or political action

Nomination Procedure

- Candidates for the award may be nominated by a boss, supervisor, mentor, colleague, student, fellow student or the candidate her- or himself.

- Nominations are to be received at the latest 12.00 on Monday the 19th of October 2015.
- Nominations should contain:
 - Motivation (maximum of 2 pages)
 - Candidates CV including name and contact information (maximum of 1 page)
 - Publication list, if applicable

All candidates will be assessed by an external committee consisting of Associate Professor Kristine Niss, RUC, Professor Nils O. Andersen, KU, and Professor Kari Tanderup, AU.
