Udnævnelse af æresdoktorer ved Aarhus Universitets årsfest fredag den 15. september 2023

Hermed indkalderne forslag fra fakulteterne om tildeling af æresdoktorgraden ved Aarhus Universitet i forbindelse med årsfesten fredag den 15. september 2023.

Forslag, ledsaget af en faglig indstilling, skal være tiltrådt af det pågældende fakultets akademiske råd.

Hvert fakultet foreslår én mandlig og én kvindelig kandidat til ærestitlen.

Herefter udpeger de akademiske råds formænd sammen én kandidat fra hvert fakultet, som sendes videre til universitetsledelsen til beslutning. Det er endvidere formanden for de enkelte akademiske råd, der underskriver indstillingen til universitetsledelsen.

Indstillingerne sendes senest mandag den 3. oktober 2022 til pa@au.dk.

Af indstillingerne bedes fremgå en kort beskrivelse af den indstillede kandidats tilknytning til Aarhus Universitet. Bemærk venligst samtidig de vedlagte retningslinjer for så vidt angår indstillingens oplysninger, format samt iagttagelse af kønsbalancen.

Retningslinjerne for tildeling af æresdoktorgrader

De overordnede regler om doktorgrader findes i bekendtgørelse 750 af 14. august 1996 om doktorgrader. Jf. bekendtgørelsens § 24 kan æresdoktorgrader tildeles forskere, der skønnes i den grad at have gjort sig videnskabeligt fortjent, at det findes naturligt at hædre dem med den højeste videnskabelige grad. Universitetet kan tildele en af de doktorgrader, der er nævnt i bekendtgørelsen, hvor universitetet har en kandidatuddannelse inden for området.

Jf. bekendtgørelsens § 1, stk. 2, kan institutionen fastsætte nærmere regler inden for bekendtgørelsens rammer. Rektor har fastsat regler af 7. maj 2012 om erhvervelsen af doktorgraden på Aarhus Universitet.

Jf. § 1, stk. 2, i Aarhus Universitets interne regler tildeles æresdoktorgraden af rektor efter indstilling fra et akademisk råd. Det bemærkes, at der kun kan tildeles æresdoktorgrader med de betegnelser, der er anført i § 3 i Aarhus Universitets interne regler.

Conferral of honorary doctorates at Aarhus University's annual celebration on Friday 15 September 2023

I am writing to announce the call for nominations for Aarhus University honorary doctorates from the faculties in connection with the annual celebration on Friday 15 September 2023.

Nominations, accompanied by an academic recommendation, must be endorsed by the relevant faculty's academic councils.

Each faculty is required to nominate one male and one female candidate for the honorary degree.

Together, the chairs of the faculty's academic councils should then select one candidate from each faculty whose name will be presented to the senior management team for decision. The chairs of the individual academic councils must also sign the final nomination submitted to the senior management team.

The faculties' nominations must be submitted by no later than Monday 3 October 2022 to pa@au.dk.

Nominations should include a brief description of the nominated candidate's affiliation with Aarhus University. In addition, we kindly ask that you follow the attached guidelines regarding content, format and considerations of gender balance.

Guidelines for awarding honorary doctoral degrees

The general rules on higher doctoral degrees are set out in Ministerial Order no. 750 of 14 August 1996 on Doctoral Degrees. According to section 24 of the Ministerial Order, the honorary doctoral degree may be awarded to researchers who have achieved such outstanding scientific results that it is considered natural to honor them with the highest academic degree. The university may award one of the doctoral degrees specified in the Ministerial Order, provided the university has a Master's degree program within the field.

According to section 1(2) of the Ministerial Order, institutions may draw up more detailed regulations within the framework of the provisions of the order. The rector has laid down the rules of 7 May 2012 for obtaining the higher doctoral degree at Aarhus University.

According to section 1(2) of Aarhus University's internal regulations, an honorary doctoral degree is awarded by the rector following nomination from an academic council. Please note that honorary doctoral degrees may only be awarded with the titles specified in section 3 of Aarhus University's internal regulations.
